UF PROMISE STUDENTS

Use this checklist to ensure you complete all required steps to receive your financial aid.

- Complete **both** the 2019-20 and the 2020-21 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.gov. Be sure to list UF's school code of 001535 so that our office receives the results of your FAFSA.
 - Participants in the 2020 Summer B Promise program will be fully funded for summer, regardless of financial need, as long as the 2019-20 FAFSA is complete.

- The 2020-21 FAFSA covers the Fall 2020, Spring 2021, and Summer 2021 semesters. You will need to reapply each year to receive financial aid. You can file a FAFSA as early as October 1 each year.
- On **ONE.UF** (<https://one.uf.edu>), students can view “**Action Items**,” then choose “**To-Dos**” to complete any and all requirements to receive the aid you have been offered. “To-Do” items include verification documentation that must be completed before some aid can be disbursed.
 - If your application is selected for verification, you will receive official notification from the Department of Education via your Federal Student Aid Report (SAR). **Do not submit any documents unless we request that you do so.**
 - Aid funds cannot be disbursed to you until you have submitted all requested documents and the accuracy of the information has been reviewed.
- To access free online personal finance tools, you can set up an account at www.cashcourse.org. CashCourse is a free resource for University of Florida students to learn about budgeting and money management skills.
